



With one garden up and running and two more in the pipeline, it's an exciting time for Horatio's Garden. This charity creates accessible gardens in NHS spinal injury centres, with it first at Salisbury Hospital, designed by Cleve West.

The second garden, at the Scottish National Spinal Injuries Unit at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital, Glasgow, is set to open in September. Its designer, James Alexander-Sinclair, says, "This is the most life-changing garden I have ever worked on.

It will be visible from the ward and will change the view from a motorway to greenery. Each window will be home to a bird feeder, so patients can watch activity from inside, meaning the garden will benefit patients even when they are on the ward."

Funds are still needed to pay the head gardener, and volunteers are also required. A third garden is being designed by Joe Swift for Stoke Mandeville Hospital. Go to **horatiosgarden.org.uk** to volunteer or donate.
